

Beloved Siblings in Christ,

The writer of John's gospel uses images of light and seeing a lot. For this gospel, seeing really is believing, and the ability to really "see" Jesus for who he is—is very important. John the Baptist's first word in Sundays Gospel is, "Here" (chapter 1:29). "Here", is a form of the word *see* in the original Greek text. A better translation might have been "Looky here!"

So Sunday, come to worship with your eyes (and ears) wide open. Come and hear a Gospel of just fourteen verses where words connected to *seeing* show up eleven times! Come and ponder where you have seen Jesus this week. When you come to worship where do you see Jesus here? How many visual references to Jesus do you have in your worship space? I just looked around my office and saw 20 different images of Jesus (not counting Tucker who embodies Jesus' unconditional love)! Some images from my office are above, stop in anytime to see Jesus in new and different ways.

Thank you to our Vestry who provided brunch and facilitated roundtable discussion and discernment last Sunday. We enjoyed a meal and fellowship as we brainstormed and listened for what God is calling us to in 2023. Our Treasurer Bill Woodard gave an overview of our financial position and Pastor Bill reviewed charts of the 78 pledged commitments by contribution ranges, 2023 income that have decrease by 3% (Fun fact: offerings = Payroll + Ministry expenses), 2023 Expenses that have increased by 4.5% (Fun fact: Lord & Tailor pledge = Benevolence which is 17% of our operating budget and does not include outreach giving from Christmas and Easter offerings, Summer Fair, or other designated giving).

The Vestry will review your offerings of ideas and prayerfully discern them and share at our annual Meeting on Sunday, January 29th (following one worship service at 9:00 am). Thank you!

The chart in the parish hall will be updated as new requests are received.


THE SOONER YOU SIGN UP, THE BETTER CHANCE YOU HAVE TO RESERVE THE DATE YOU WANT!

January 10, 17, 24 - *Lessons in Chemistry* a novel by Bonnie Garmus

Chemist Elizabeth Zott is not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. But it's the early 1960s and her all-male team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans; the lonely, brilliant, Nobel–prize nominated grudge-holder who falls in love with—of all things—her mind. True chemistry results. But like science, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother, but the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show Supper at Six. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy because she isn't just teaching women to cook. She's daring them to change the status quo.




Be a Greeter!
