

Sunday we'll hear a lot about salt and light in worship. The Gospel reading is a continuation of the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5:13-20) which we heard last Sunday. We'll hear Jesus encouraging his followers to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world, doing good works and keeping God's commandments.

The Rev. Dr. Barbara Lundblad, *Professor Emerita of Preaching* at Union Theological Seminary writes that" for Jesus, salt and light came out of a long tradition of biblical teaching: salt and light were images for the law of God. Salt and light must take us back

The prophets plead for fullness of life: freedom from oppression, bread for the hungry, homes for those who have none, clothing for the naked. Is this not what it means to be the salt of the earth, to keep this prophetic word alive in the midst of our world? If we lose this vision, if we give in to other values, if we forget God's longing for justice, our salt has lost its taste. If you think Jesus' call is impossible, remember that the One who is our bread is with us and within us, empowering us to be salt and light in this world."

At our annual meeting on Sunday, we reflected on how we have been salt and light through our shared ministry of keeping God's prophetic word lit in a world that too often tries to blow it out with hatred and fear. God has gathered and provided for us together to plead for fullness of life as we advocate, clothe, and feed out neighbor. Thank you for all you do to be salt and light in the strong name of Jesus and by the power of the Holy Spirit!




# THE SOONER YOU SIGN UP, THE BETTER CHANCE YOU HAVE TO RESERVE THE DATE YOU WANT!


**The** cost of the Altar flowers for a Sunday is \$35.00. Please provide payment to the office before the dedication date.

January 10, 17, 24 - <u>Lessons in Chemistry</u> a novel by Bonnie Garmus

Chemist Elizabeth Zott is not your average woman. In fact, Elizabeth Zott would be the first to point out that there is no such thing as an average woman. But it's the early 1960s and her all-male team at Hastings Research Institute takes a very unscientific view of equality. Except for one: Calvin Evans; the lonely, brilliant, Nobel—prize nominated grudge-holder who falls in love with—of all things—her mind. True chemistry results. But like science, life is unpredictable. Which is why a few years later Elizabeth Zott finds herself not only a single mother, but the reluctant star of America's most beloved cooking show Supper at Six. Elizabeth's unusual approach to cooking proves revolutionary. But as her following grows, not everyone is happy because she isn't just teaching women to cook. She's daring them to change the status quo.




## Be a Greeter!

Guide us to all truth by your Spirit, that we may proclaim all that Christ has revealed and rejoice in the glory he shares with us. Glory and praise to you, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and forever. Amen.

The Letter to the Hebrews is one of the more sophisticated New Testament writings, with the author connecting the Old Testament passages to the present concerns of the community of faith. We will gather Thursday afternoons at 3:00 pm in the Beck Memorial Library and online via Zoom to walk through this New Testament book examining the thematic questions: Who Is Jesus?, What Did Jesus Do?, What Is Faith?, How Shall We Live?, and What If Faith Fails?
