




#### Actively Stand Against Racism and White Supremacy

# Supporting Partners in Turkey and Syria after the Earthquake

Episcopal Relief & Development is mobilizing with long-term partners after a 7.8-magnitude earthquake in Turkey and Syria on Monday, February 6, 2023. The

earthquake killed over 11,000 people and caused widespread damage across the region.

Working through <u>Action by Churches Together Alliance</u> (ACT Alliance), Episcopal Relief & Development will rapidly respond to the disaster through existing networks by providing supplies including winterization kits, hot meals and other food, medicine and emergency support. The organization is also in contact with other local partners as they assess the needs of their communities.

"The reports from Turkey and Syria are heart-wrenching," said Abagail Nelson, Executive Vice President and Chief Strategy Officer, Episcopal Relief & Development. "We have worked closely with ACT Alliance in our response to the crisis in Ukraine and we will continue to partner to meet the immediate needs of the affected communities in Turkey and Syria."

Please continue to <u>pray</u> for those who have been affected by the earthquake. Donations to the <u>Turkey-Syria Earthquake Response Fund</u> will help the organization to continue to respond to communities impacted by this disaster.

For over 80 years, Episcopal Relief & Development has been working together with supporters and partners for lasting change around the world. 


