Beloved Saints and Sinners,

It's a shortened form of *lencten*, an Old English word for "spring season." But it literally means "spring," smacking not of obligation but of opportunity. Lent is a time when we can reprioritize what we are about, both as individuals and as communities of faith. It is an opportunity to center our hearts and minds on Jesus, renew our call to love and serve the Lord, and share our gifts and passions with others for the sake of the world.

May each step of your Lenten pilgrimage have a "spring" to it as you walk sustained by the power of the Holy Spirit this season.

Liturgical Colors Make Us Smile

Liturgical Colors used in worship signify our place in the Church Year. We found a bunch of smiling folks in seasonally appropriate colors at coffee hour last Sunday. Thanks Cee for the photos!



For Lent we use purple symbolizing penance, sacrifice, and preparation. The color reminds us of the violet flower that bows its head and is a symbol of humility. Lent is the season of prayer, fasting, almsgiving and is a quiet season of reflection.



For Holy Week we use oxblood red symbolizing God's Love, blood, and fire. The color has traditionally been associated with martyrs – those who have shed their blood for their faith – and so it is worn on the feast days of martyrs.






Dinner Bell DINING IN PERSON IN THE PARISH HALL THURSDAYS 5:00 PM
