Baptized Beloveds,


"In my Father's house there are many dwelling places. If it were not so, would I have told you that I go to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again and will take you to myself, so that where I am, there you may be also."

—John 14:2-3

Jesus' words in Sunday's gospel from John are most often heard during a funeral service. It is a popular choice of scripture for that occasion because the words provide wonderful assurance that the one who has died in Christ has now taken up residence in their heavenly home. The gospel begins by Jesus saying that he will prepare a place for each one of us. But as the text continues, we can see that our place is not an isolated

Almighty God, whom truly to know is everlasting life: Grant us so perfectly to know your Son Jesus Christ to be the way, the truth, and the life, that we may steadfastly

Jesus' words are less about a place in heaven, than a promised relationship between us, Jesus and God the Father. They tell us that in Jesus we know all we need to know about God, and just as we can have a relationship with another human person, we can also have a relationship with God that will one day be as real and obvious as are our relationships with one another. The hope of one day being with Christ fully and forever is as real as the works we are called to do in his name today.

Jesus' words about the Father's house and its many dwelling places have been literalized for many Christians, as if heaven were a king's mansion with outbuildings provided for the lesser inhabitants. Instead they are about living into our relationship with God each week. Here in God's house we gather with the Holy One, Holy Three who forgives, feeds and sustains you and me. So come to worship this week as we contemplate what heaven will be like, an ultimately unknowable, but central part of our faith.

Christ is Risen. He is Risen Indeed! **Bill+**

P.S. Easter isn't just one day — it's 50! Rather than just being an extended celebration of Jesus' resurrection, the Easter season is a time of continued faith formation for all Christians. Today, we celebrate it as a time to rejoice and experience what we mean when we say Christ is risen and that we, as the church, are the body of the Risen Lord.






Have a problem with alcohol? There is a solution.
