Beloveds of All Saints,

This Sunday we begin the almost six month season of the church year following Pentecost called Ordinary Time. You will notice a number of liturgical changes in worship during these beginning months and in particular, the Eucharistic Prayer which is also called The Great Thanksgiving, the anaphora, the prayer of consecration, and the canon of the Mass.

While the *Book of Common Prayer* and the authorized supplement Enriching Our Worship have a diversity and variety of Eucharistic prayers, you may remember earlier prayer books which had only one. In many parishes, Eucharistic prayers are chosen in light of the seasons or occasions of the church year. Liturgical scholars Samuel Wells and Abigail Kocher in their 2016 book Eucharistic Prayers, say that these prayers should be "a flame of holy fire kindled in the hearts of all who are gathered, stirring memories and hopes, evoking gratitude and exaltation, taking worshipers to heaven to sing with the angels and to Calvary to face the horror of the cross and

We begin Ordinary Time with Eucharistic Prayer 3 which includes these powerful words:


And so remembering all that was done for us: the cross, the tomb, the resurrection and ascension, longing for Christ's coming in glory, and presenting to you these gifts your earth has formed and human hands have made, we acclaim you, O Christ:

Dying, you destroyed our death. Rising, you restored our life. Christ Jesus, come in glory!

And then we ask God to 'grant that we, burning with your Spirit's power, may be a people of hope, justice, and love." As we enter these weeks after Pentecost, may we remember that we are powered by the Spirit to live and share hope, justice and love, words that I need to hear again and again.

May this most ordinary of time show you our extraordinary God who meets us in Word and Sacrament.




Return of the Common Cup as an Option



On Pentecost, following guidance from Bishop +Rob to clergy and discussion with our Worship and Music Team and Vestry, we began the option of receiving wine by common cup as we offer the option of gluten free bread during Holy Communion. The Eucharistic Ministers will continue to distribute wine via individual cups and if you desire the common cup*, please ask Pastor Bill (just as you would for gluten free).

New Bible Study Begins Thursday, June 8th



We celebrate the Feast of Pentecost on May 28th and ask you to wear red to church that day as it is the liturgical color of the day. Our worship space will reflect the color as we remember the descent of the Holy Spirit on that first Day of Pentecost following the Resurrection and Ascension of the Lord Jesus Christ. Pentecost Sunday initiates a whole season of Pentecost, or Ordinary Time, in which we remember that the whole of the Christian life, indeed the whole life of the Church is 'pneumatic', that is fueled and furthered by the powerful work of the Holy Spirit.


