A priest associate is a priest whose full-time ministry is outside the parish but who is assigned or attached to an altar within a parish community. As a priest associate, Liz will be with us during summers in a nonstipendiary role to share in worship as well as bible study, our community book group Wolfeboro Reads, and other areas of ministry of interest to her. During the academic year Liz serves as the Associate Chaplain at St. Andrew's School in Middletown, DE, where she teaches Religious Studies and Spanish.

A graduate of Yale University Divinity
School whose diaconal ordination was held
here at All Saints during the pandemic, she
has taught Spanish at Tilton School and
English at the University of New Hampshire.
Liz and husband Sam Ingraham are familiar
faces to us as for the past ten summers, she
has taught writing and literature for the
Royal Thai Scholars Program at Brewster
Academy, and they are building a house

Independence and Civil Discourse

There used to be a wise saying about arguments that helped keep things civil. One party or the other would say, "I disagree with what you say, but I defend with my life your right to say it."

That sounds downright quaint in today's climate, where partisans are more likely to say, "I disagree with what you say, and you are evil and have no right to that opinion!"

This month, as we celebrate Independence Day, we can relish the freedoms we take for granted, including freedom of speech, religion, and assembly. At the same time, as Christians we remember Jesus' commands not only to love our neighbors as ourselves (Mark 12:31) but also to do unto others as we would have them do to us (Matthew 7:12). The "neighbors" and "others" certainly include those who hold different ideas on issues of the day.

How can we celebrate our freedom of expression in the context of Jesus' commands?

- · Listen carefully, being open to another person's ideas.
- · Respond thoughtfully and calmly, citing facts to support your argument.
- · Do not attack the person, only the ideas.
- · If things get too heated, discontinue the discussion.
- Remember the wise old saying, "I disagree with what you say, but I defend with my life your right to say it."

We are stewards of our relationships with our neighbors. As followers of Jesus, we can be stewards of civility and lead our country to calmer, more amicable times.

Whether you've started, or you've been attending for a little while, or for years, you're


