

Sunday July 23 The Eighth Sunday after Pentecost church fathers and mothers, seeking comments from the great cloud of witnesses that have gone before us. This week that was Jerome [Jerome, in *The Sunday Sermons of the Great Fathers*, I, 331.]...

For if we are forbidden to uproot the tares, and if we are to wait in patience until the harvest time, how then are we to cast out certain persons from amongst us? Between the true wheat and the tares, while the latter is still green, and the stalk has not yet come into ear, there is a great similarity, and little or no difference between them, so as to tell one from the other. The Lord therefore warns us that in the beginning we are not to be too ready to deliver judgment, where anything is uncertain; but that we leave judgment to God, so that when the day of the Judge shall come, he shall exclude the wicked from the company of the blessed, not on the mere suspicion of having committed an offence, but because of manifest guilt.

Leave the judgement to God are words that leap from this piece of wisdom for me. Too often, especially when I engage the news of the day, or encounter another conspiracy theory, or evil person who spoof/clones me and sends many of you e-mails or texts seeking money or gift cards... I rush to judgement, get so frustrated and angry, that it sometimes ruins my day, usually positive outlook, and I get stuck in the muck and mire of sin, wandering away from Jesus, and off of the Way of Love.

May you remember God's justice towards you and all people through the wisdom of the Great Cloud of Witnesses, and the teachings and actions of Jesus, **Bill+**

P.S. "Every time I think of you I thank God for you. I have joy in my heart every time I ask God to help you. I thank God for the joy we share in telling the good news from the very first day until now." These words from Philippians 1:3-5 were top of mind following our 61st Annual Summer Fair. 


