Sunday's Gospel reading has Jesus meeting the disciples in the midst of a storm, and Peter seeks proof of Jesus' identity by trying to join him on the wind-tossed waves. After Peter falters, the storm calms as they return to the boat. In the boat, the enormity of what has just happened fills the silence.

Silence... in a world filled with noise and empty words, God comes to us as stillness and silence, even to the point that wind ceases (Matthew 14:32). Jesus walks over stormy waters then to his disciples, and to you and me today. Jesus enters the boats of our lives wherever we are whether sailing smooth or stormy seas. Jesus meets us where we are and is present with us despite our deepest fears and frenzied doubts.




