Sunday's Gospel reading has Jesus meeting the disciples in the midst of a storm, and Peter seeks proof of Jesus' identity by trying to join him on the wind-tossed waves. After Peter falters, the storm calms as they return to the boat. In the boat, the enormity of what has just happened fills the silence.

Silence... in a world filled with noise and empty words, God comes to us as stillness and silence, even to the point that wind ceases (Matthew 14:32). Jesus walks over stormy waters then to his disciples, and to you and me today. Jesus enters the boats of our lives wherever we are whether sailing smooth or stormy seas. 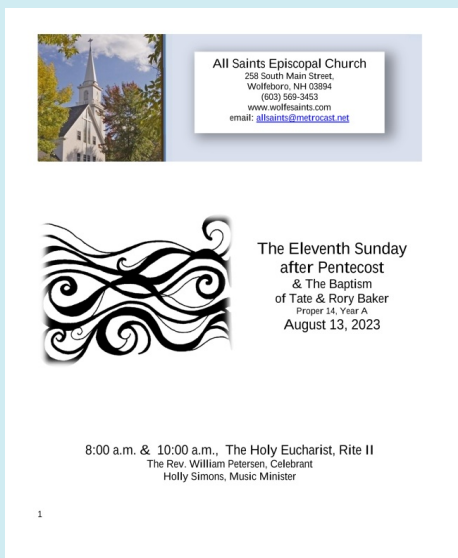

On August 4th and 5th, our parish community was excited to welcome the "Ladies of the Lake Quilters' Guild" to our church hall and sanctuary. The pictures attest to the amazing and skilled craftsmanship of these women.

By volunteering their time, skills and fabrics, these ladies make hundreds of quilts for critically ill children; comfort quilts for police, fire and EMT's to distribute to families in crisis; provide quilts for the child Advocacy Center, and Hope House for families in transition; and the list goes on..

We are grateful for their loving presence and tremendous quilting in our Lakes Region Community. This non-profit organization, formed in 1979, has 140 members committed to these acts of service. They meet on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month at First Congregational Church on Main Street here in Wolfeboro.

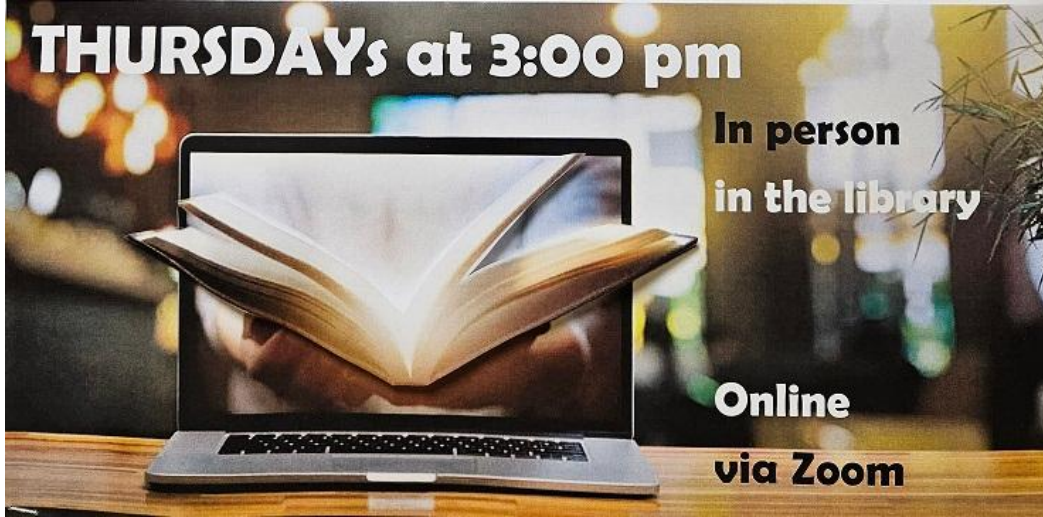

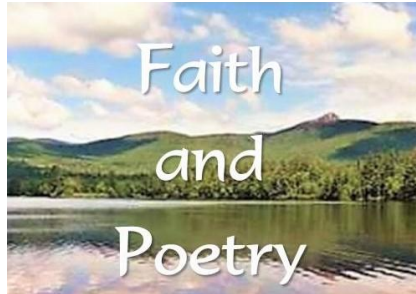

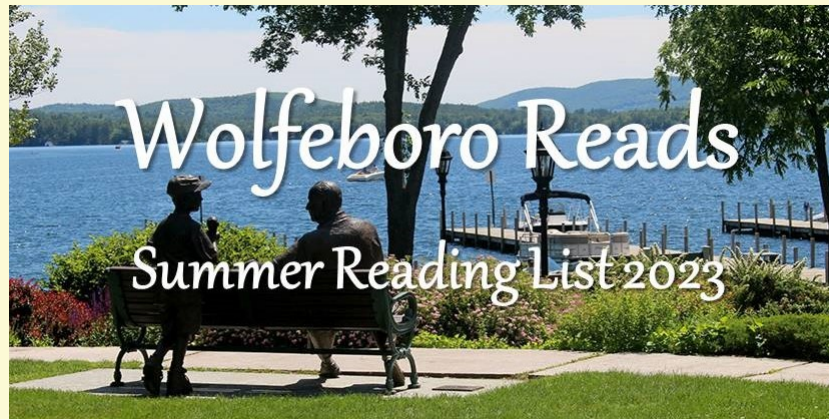
