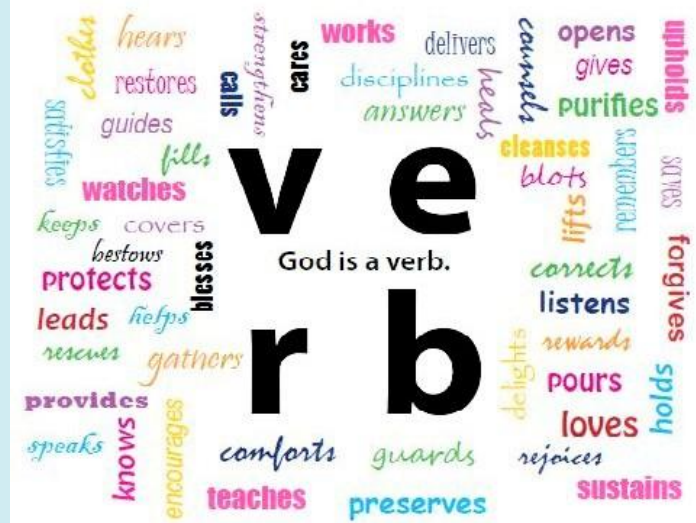

God's Verbs

Through the lens of the gospel, Sunday's texts offer a clear identification of God's work. What is God doing? God is reaching out to the bound-up to proclaim release from captivity. God is lifting up the oppressed. God is satisfying the needs of the afflicted. God raises up foundations. God restores and rebuilds, reconciles and sets free. God, whose word can shake the very foundations of the earth, speaks a better word than we've ever heard, or that we could ever speak. Like yeast that's included in bread dough or the seed of a particularly stubborn weed sown in the garden (Luke 13:18-21), when God speaks, there's no going back. The bread will be leavened; the garden will have a

mustard bush; and precious daughters and sons of Abraham will be set free. It is God's work and God's activity that Isaiah calls us to be about. Why is the prophet so confident that light will conquer darkness and needs will be satisfied? Because this is already God's work, or as the prophet says, because "the mouth of the Lord has spoken."

These texts focus us on the *verbs*, the actions, of God. When we're attuned to the verbs of God within passages like these, it might make it easier to see and give witness to God's work and the verbs around us right now. [*Sundays and Seasons, 2022*]

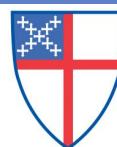

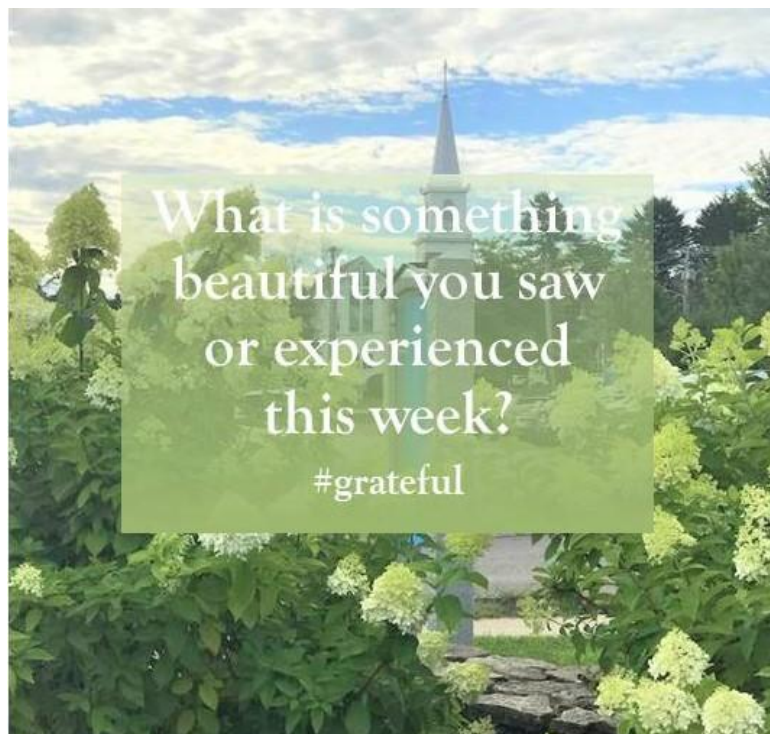
PRESCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS AVAILABLE!

Families simply need to provide basic tax forms with scholarships awarded based on an income sliding scale. Scholarships range from \$20 per month to full tuition.

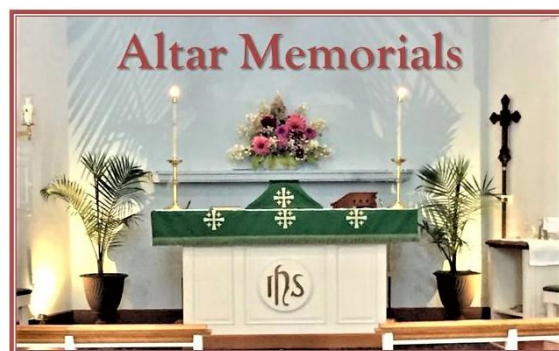

ENERGY IMPROVEMENTS in the Outreach Building

The Solar Saints Initiative and LIFE Ministries Food Pantry have been working together to make significant improvements to their food cold storage system. The food pantry had nine food cold storage units (four commercial freezers, one commercial refrigerator, three residential standup freezers and one chest freezer). Solar Saints did an energy audit measuring the energy use of every one of these nine units. In combination, it was determined that all nine units consumed 68% of the total electricity used by the entire Outreach Building, 29,414 kWhs of electricity annually. For reference, this level of energy usage is equivalent to what three household normally use in a year and is more than the electricity produced by both the front and side solar arrays on our church. More importantly, it was determine that just two of these units consumed 61% of the total of all nine units. On Monday, 7/26/2022, these two very inefficient units were replace with new Energy Star freezers. It is projected that over the next twelve years, these two new freezers will save over 129,727 kWhs of electricity worth an estimated \$22,028 (compared to the old freezers). Besides the two replacement freezers, the Pantry purchased two additional freezers, increasing their total cold food storage capacity by 17.6%. Even with this increased storage capacity, it is estimated that the Pantry's total food cold storage energy usage with decrease by 19.7% compared the previous system. The energy audit was funded in part through a grant from New Hampshire Interfaith Power and Light- Thanks!

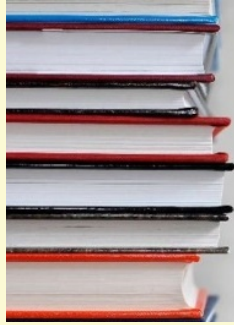

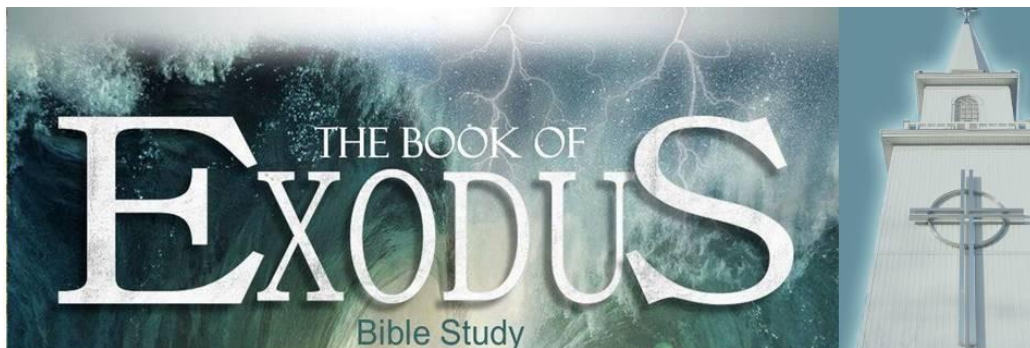


Be a Greeter!
