

We who follow Jesus and the Way of Love are formed over time—shaped by learning, worship, and all aspects of Christian life in community. As it was for Peter in the Gospel reading for Sunday, part of our formation is learning to confess Jesus as the Messiah, not only with the right words but also through an experience of the Living God in Christ. And along with Peter, through such formation we also discover who we are in relation to God: After Peter "confesses" Jesus' identity of Messiah, Jesus "confesses" Peter's identity by calling out his name and vocation.

Peter's confession is not a precondition for following Jesus; it comes in the middle of his journey of discipleship. Our formation too is a lifelong process which begins at baptism and is shaped and guided by those who travel before and with us. At this time of year, as we explore our own formation, identity, and vocation as disciples (lifelong learner followers) of Jesus, Isaiah asks us to, "look to the rock from which you were hewn" which is Jesus the cornerstone and foundation of our faith.

May you consider new ways to be formed as a follower of Jesus to share his way of love,

They blew in the wind softly, this way, that way. They were not disappointed when they

saw the scissors, rather they braced themselves sweetly and shone with willingness. They were on tall and tender poles, with wheels of leaves. They were soft as the ears of kittens. They felt warm in recognition of the summer day. A dozen was plenty. I held them in my arms. They



were silent the way the deepest water is silent. If they wondered where they were going they didn't show it, as they sprinkled freely over my shirt and my hands their precious gold dust.





New Thursday Afternoon Study for




