Is discomfort a sign of grace? For those who have been participating in the Jonah Bible Study this month, we've been wrestling with this as Jonah was a guy who could never get comfortable (and we'll hear about Jonah Sunday in the first lesson). Poor Jonah...

- was uncomfortable with his God-given call to preach to Nineveh;
- then uncomfortable in the arms of the sailors as they threw him overboard;
- · uncomfortable as the ocean's raging waves flung him about;
- · uncomfortable in the fish's belly; and
- · uncomfortable and downright angry with God's mercy on the people of Nineveh. Jonah had a hard time getting comfortable with himself, and, even more so, Jonah was uneasy embracing the wideness of God's grace.



same as others who started later and worked fewer hours. These laborers are not happy with the landowner's choice "to give to this last the same as I give to you." Like Jonah, they are uncomfortable with the unchecked mercy offered by the landowner/God. God doesn't play by our rules, and that can be very discomforting for us all.

We experience discomfort with grace in many ways. It can be discomforting for us...

- to engage the poor and the outcast of our society;
- to welcome immigrants into our communities;
- to address the pervasive racism that still surrounds us; and
- · for us to open our lives to the transforming power of the cross of Christ, whereby "the last will be first, and the first will be last" (Matthew 20:16). Could it be that the more uncomfortable we become with the reckless love of God, the closer we are to understanding the meaning of grace?




### **October Thursday Bible Study**

Thursdays in the Beck Library and online via Zoom at 3:00 pm, followed by Eucharist


First impressions stick with us. Paul's first impression of the Thessalonian Christians was an especially powerful one: The gospel message he preached grasped their hearts and minds, and







