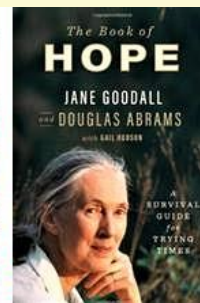
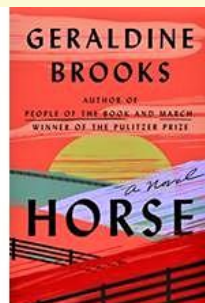
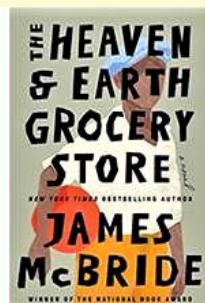
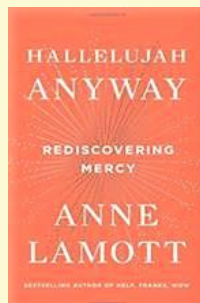
October Thursday Bible Study
