

Certainly the images of the destruction and an increasing death toll from Florida have an impact on us all. For me, compassion for those impacted grieving loss of loved ones and life as they knew it before the storm, is mixed with my own disconnected grief following the death of an aunt and former sister-in-law's brother in September.

climate change that is no longer a future event. I grieve as creation groans through increasing fires, floods, droughts and tornados so many individuals and communities have faced this year. More and more we experience what are called 100 or 500 year events that reduce hometowns to rubble, blowing, burning, or washing away community infrastructure and lifestyles built over generations. I grieve the lack of urgency for human fueled climate change that is the central issue of our time, impacted every other challenge we face.

Grief over climate change is like any other grief, deeply painful and not something we can process or get-over. Grief is something we carry and can either cause us to shut down or move us to action. It is important to grieve the resulting loss as poet Adrienne Rich does so well...

*My heart is moved by all I cannot save:*

*so much has been destroyed*

*I have to cast my lot with those*

*who, age after age,*

*Perversely and with no extraordinary*

*power, reconstitute the world.*

This past Sunday we joined with Christians around the world to celebrate in prayer and action our Gospel calling to protect the Earth that God has entrusted to our care. We also blessed animals and remembered Francis of Assisi who had a spirit of gratitude for all of God's creation. May you find ways to embody that spirit of gratitude in your grief and action as you care for creation this and all seasons.



From The Music Corner...




Beloved friends,

Members of the altar flower delivery team can pick up copies of the delivery schedule in the flower room and won't be receiving it in their email. Thank you. Lynne Slocum






## Be a Greeter!

## Thursday Bible Study

We are currently studying the Book of Exodus. If you have not received the Thursday Afternoon Bible Study e-mails before and would like to be added, please share your e-mail with Pastor Bill.

The message of Exodus is of God acting to free a powerless people and bring them into covenant relationship. This event reveals God's faithfulness to Israel and to Egypt and all other nations of the world as well. The exodus is so important that it is even used to describe who God is: "I am the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery" (Exodus 20:2). The people become the Lord's "treasured possession out of all the people's," "a priestly kingdom," and "a holy nation" (Exodus 19:5-6) and receive the Torah to show them how to live in relationship with this gracious and liberating God through the everyday activities of life.
