This Sunday is the feast day of Teresa of Avila (Oct. 15), who notably struggled with her prayer life. Yet the church recognizes her as someone who stood firm in the Lord. Her witness is a reminder that sometimes instructions and encouragement, like Paul's words in Philippians Sunday to rejoice and give thanks to God no matter what the circumstance, are not so easily applied. Isaiah 25:1-9 The feast of victory Psalm 23 You prepare a table before me, and my cup is running over Philippians 4:1-9 Rejoice in the Lord always Matthew 22:1-14 The parable of the unwelcome She was a monastic reformer born in Avila, Spain who entered the monastery of the Incarnation of the Carmelite nuns in 1534. While a nun she had numerous visions including one in which she was convinced that Christ was present to her in bodily form, though invisible. Teresa was very much concerned about the laxity in the Carmelite monasteries and resolved to reform them. In 1562 she established the monastery of St. Joseph in Avila, and there she wrote the first of her mystical treatises, The Way of Perfection. She died in Alba de Tormes, and was canonized in 1622, declared a Doctor of the Church by the Roman Catholic Church for her writing and teaching on prayer.

When I struggle in my spiritual life, Teresa of Avila's work reminds me that struggle and perseverance is part of our journey following Jesus. A sample of her writings follow for your inspiration when you struggle...

• Let nothing perturb you, nothing frighten you. All things pass.

• Christ is no stranger to suffering and loss, let us turn to him with our questions and our prayers, praying always "Jesus, we trust in you."

• May today there be peace within. May you trust God that you are exactly where you are meant to be.

• May you not forget the infinite possibilities that are born of faith.

• May you be content knowing you are a child of God. Let this presence settle into your bones, and allow your soul the freedom to sing, dance, praise and love. It is there for each and every one of us.

• Christ has no body now, but yours. No hands, no feet on earth, but yours. Yours are the eyes through which Christ looks compassion into the world. Yours are the feet with which Christ walks to do good. Yours are the hands with which Christ blesses the world.



A Statement & Prayer after the Hamas Attacks

Dear Friends in Christ,

There is no cause righteous, just, or honorable that ever justifies, or is in any way furthered by, the acts of sheer horror and brutality that we have seen levied on the civilians of Israel by the terrorist organization Hamas over the weekend.

As we watch in shock the violence unleashed by these actions, we followers of Jesus are called to pray, fervently, for a cessation of these hostilities, for protection for the most vulnerable on both sides of the Israel and Gaza border, and for a recommitment by the international community to find the way to a lasting and just peace between Israelis and Palestinians. Let us pray also that the rage that exists on both sides of this deep-rooted and bloody conflict may not infect our own hearts and that God may heal us from the sins of antisemitism, anti-Judaism, and Islamophobia.

I invite the members of the Church of New Hampshire to join me in this prayer:

O God, come and turn the hearts of those who are convinced that unleashing hatred and violence will bring righteousness. Quickly remove the allure of terror from the hearts of those who would inflict it. Protect those at risk of injury and death. Make the response to such hatred be motivated by justice and not pure hatred or the unrestrained impulse for revenge. Protect all children and those who have no defense or shelter from the current storm. Come quickly to establish your Realm of peace and righteousness. O Christ, even now you extend your arms of love on the cross that all may come within the reach of your healing and life-giving embrace, raise us with you a new vision, a new way of living in your Holy Presence. In your Holy Name. Amen.

The Vestry met on Monday, September 18th. Here's a quick summary of our meeting. Please ask questions of any member if you'd like more information.






October Thursday Bible Study Thursdays in the Beck Library and online via Zoom at 3:00 pm, followed by Eucharist


First impressions stick with us. Paul's first impression of the Thessalonian Christians was an especially powerful one: The gospel message he preached grasped their hearts and minds, and
