


Challenge - Have you turned in your piece of the puzzle as your part




### **Thursday Bible Study** Thursdays in the Beck Library and online via Zoom at 3:00 pm, followed by Eucharist


First impressions stick with us. Paul's first impression of the Thessalonian Christians was an especially powerful one: The gospel message he preached grasped their hearts and minds, and
