history.

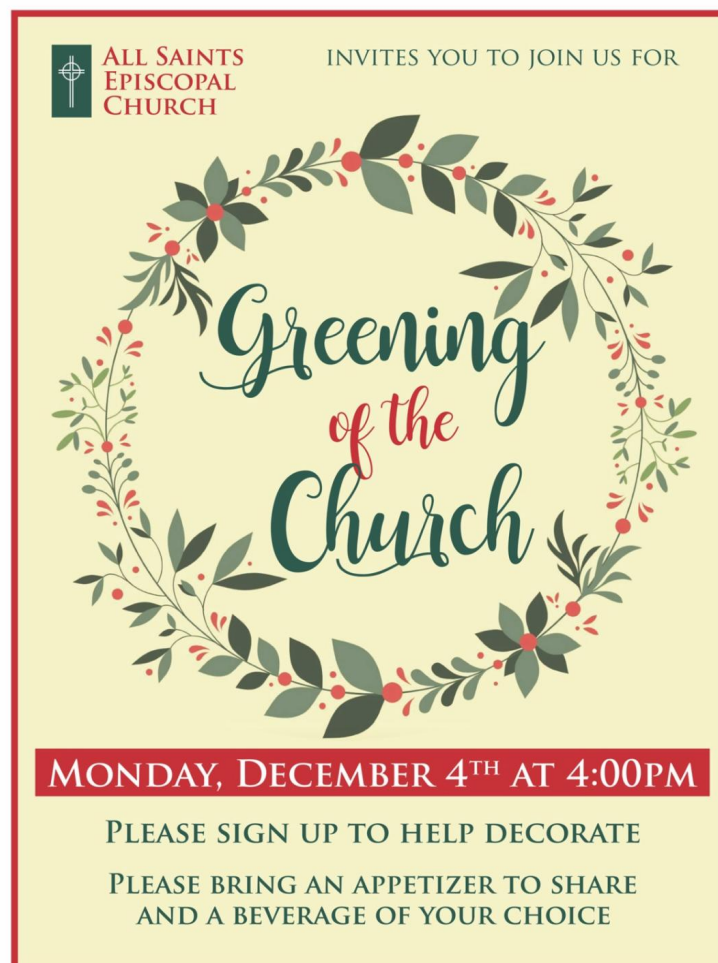

**Thursdays in the Beck Library and online via Zoom at 3:00 pm, followed by Eucharist**

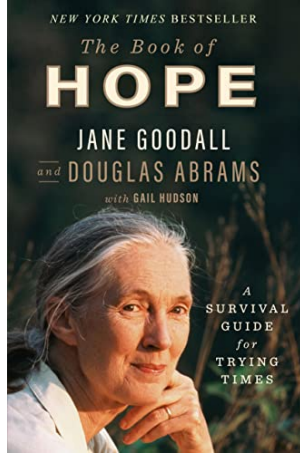
