Advent 2023 The Weary World Waits. **REJOICE!**

Beloveds of All Saints,

This week we mark the third Sunday of Advent that is traditionally focused on rejoicing as the advent of our Messiah draws near. This week we also encounter John the Baptist again who in his unique way, calls for rejoicing by noting that he is *not* what we are waiting for. John, like each of us, has a mission to bear witness, but when he says "I am not," we hear a clear contrast to all the ways Jesus will identify himself with the Father:

"I am the bread of life." "I am the resurrection." "I am the good shepherd."

Jesus will be these things for God's people, but John's job is simply to bear witness to the light of his cousin Jesus the Christ.



He came to a world which did not mesh, to heal its tangles, shield its scorn, In the mystery of the Word made Flesh the Maker of the stars was born.


We cannot wait till the world is sane To raise our songs with joyful voice... For to share our grief, to touch our pain, He came with Love: Rejoice! Rejoice!

Christmas 2023 in the Holy Land

Our image of a Bethlehem birth where 'all is calm and all is bright' does not reflect the realities of Bethlehem at the incarnation, nor today. God is with us, breaking into our world, accompanying and comforting the suffering as shown in the nativity from Christmas Lutheran Church in Bethlehem below. For the first time in modern history, there will be no Christmas tree or Christmas celebrations in Bethlehem. The birth of the Prince of peace will be celebrated in holy services only.



Christmas Church Pastor the Rev. Munther Isaac notes that Christmas in Palestine this year has the Christ Child under the rubble. He says: "The child of Bethlehem is our hope. For the children of Gaza and all victims of wars. In Gaza today, God is under the rubble. He is in the operating room. If Christ were to be born today, he would be born under the rubble. We see his image in every child killed and pulled from under the rubble. In every child in incubators."






Thursday Afternoon Bible Study for December


