Advent carries two simultaneous visions of our expectations: we await yet again the birth of the babe in the manager, and we also await Chris's coming again to highling all hings. We often prepare for Advent by "genting read"; "planning, organizing, and ordering supplies for various gatherings and working services. Yet preparing for the coming of Christ is not a matter of having everything under control. Christ's arrival disrupts disrupts high and the services in a society in white we are deeply embedded. A prayer for Christ to come is a prayer for a holy disruption of our lives that we cannot control and the we might struggle to accept.

brings salvation to all people and one of my theologically favorite hymns that sings this is "Savior of the nations, come" (Hymnal 1982 #54):

Savior of the nations, come; virgin's son, make here your home.

Marvel Now, O heav'n and earth: God has chosen such a birth.

This Advent hymn, attributed to Ambrose of Milan and Martin Luther, takes us as singers to the manger "shining bright."

Now your manger, shining bright, hallows night with newborn light.

Night cannot this light subdue; let our faith shine ever new.

This hymn resounds with the magnitude of Jesus' birth, Emanuel—God with us: Not by human flesh and blood, but the mystic Breath of God, was the Word of God made flesh.


I invite you to imagine the mystic breath of God giving voice and filling the lungs of all who will gather at All Saints' this Christmas Eve so that "the heavens rejoice" and "the earth be glad", echoing Psalm 96:11. This is a powerful image for a world wearied from Covid, RSV and war which all take our breath away! And yet, through our breath, God's love is shared and salvation comes.

Update on Efforts to Sponsor Afghan Refugees in Pakistan to Immigrate to Manchester

Several months ago, Amadou Hamady, Warren Muir, and Sarah Day briefed the parish about an effort to sponsor a family of seven Afghan Hazara refugees who fled Afghanistan to Pakistan, where they remain at great risk. (**Grandma Feroza**, [her daughter, **Rana**, son-in-law, **Ali**, and their son, **Amir**], [her daughter-in-law and widow, **Nasiba**, with children, **Maisam** and **Maryam**].) Warren has been tutoring Ali and Maisam for over eight years.

The second phase of the new US Welcome Corps program, which is imminent, will enable groups of US citizens to sponsor refugees known to them. This is the first possibility for the Afghan Hazara family member to immigrate to the US. With the support of the All Saints community and others, a group of six individuals (including Warren, Sarah, and Amadou) will make a formal Welcome Corps application to sponsor the family to immigrate to Manchester. We anticipate that approval of the group may take two or three months, then the proposed refugees will be vetted thoroughly by Federal Agencies prior to approval. If approved, the Welcome Corps group will need to raise enough money to support the family for their first three months prior to their arrival.

Afghan family updates:

1) In October, the Government of Pakistan announced that it was going to deport many hundreds of thousands of Afghan refugees in the country back to Afghanistan by November 1. Many Afghans have been forced to go back from where they fled. So far, our family has not been deported and have UNHCR Refugee-Seeking Identification that hopefully will spare them.

2) Rana and Ali had a second son, **Omid**, born on Oct 26,2023. So, the family now has eight members.

3) Maryam graduated this week from the local coeducational (non-Madrassa) high school. Every year she has been either first or second in her class. While also a gifted artist, she has no status in Pakistan to be able to further her education. so we dream and wait for you. Bless us and let your face shine upon us, more radiant than these candles, and more dear than all else we seek. Restore us when we fail to refuse the evil and choose the good, and banish all our fears. We pray in the name of Emmanuel, your promised child and our Savior. Amen.






Thursday Afternoon Bible Study meeting December 28th


