

Beloved Siblings in Christ,

["Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia!"] Okay, don't say the Alleluia until the Great Vigil of Easter on Saturday night, or The Sunday of the Resurrection of Our Lord, AKA Easter, but I can't wait to shout it from the rooftops (and some of you won't read this today/Good Friday anyway).

I invite you to join us for the Great Vigil of Easter tomorrow/Saturday at 6:30 pm because it is the night of salvation! At the Vigil of Easter, we gather around fire, word, water, bread, and wine, proclaiming through story and song that ours is a God who continuously brings life out of death. On this night we experience again the heart of God's baptismal promise and the center of our faith: we are claimed and cleansed, renewed in the death



The Collect of the Day

Almighty God, who through your only-begotten Son Jesus Christ overcame death and opened to us the gate of everlasting life: Grant that we, who celebrate with joy the day of the Lord's and resurrection of Christ.

Forgotten by most Christians for about 1400 years, the Easter Vigil ends the Triduum (the three days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday) and is a central worship service of the year. Weather permitting, we gather outside to light a great fire, praising the risen Christ as our light. We then sing songs and hear beloved stories, inspiring poems, delightful tales, and the Easter gospel, all of which proclaim that God is always giving new life. We then thank God for baptism. Finally we conclude this three-day service with the first holy communion of Easter, and we get to sing Alleluia again.








Thursdays in the Beck Library and online via Zoom at 3:00 pm, followed by Eucharist



Tuesdays, April 9, 16, 23 4:00 pm, Rough Sleepers by Tracy Kidder

When Jim O'Connell graduated from Harvard Medical School and was nearing the end of his residency at Massachusetts General Hospital, the chief of medicine made a proposal: Would he defer a prestigious fellowship and spend a year



helping to create an organization to bring health care to homeless citizens? Jim took the job because he felt he couldn't refuse. But that year turned into his life's calling. Tracy Kidder spent five years following Dr. O'Connell and his colleagues as they served their thousands of homeless patients. In this book, we travel with O'Connell as he navigates the city, offering medical care, socks, soup, empathy, humor, and friendship to some of the city's most vulnerable citizens. He emphasizes a style of medicine in which patients come first, joined with their providers in what he calls "a system of friends."
