Beloved Siblings in Christ,

The gospel for the third Sunday of Easter is always one in which Jesus the risen Christ shares food with the disciples (meals that are the Easter echo we share weekly in the Eucharist). In Sunday's gospel, Jesus both shares the disciples' meal of broiled fish and shows them the meaning of his suffering, death, and resurrection through the scriptures, the two main elements of our Sunday worship.

Fish has always been a Christian symbol, perhaps honoring the disciples who had been fishermen, or

perhaps because of a Jewish poetic tradition that described fish as the main course served at the messianic banquet. Eating fish may have also symbolized faith in the demise of the ancient evil sea monster. Jesus eating the broiled fish affirms the physical nature of his resurrection and emphasizes the importance he places on meal fellowship. Sharing meals continues to be an essential part of our faith life whenever we gather in our worship space, the parish hall for potlucks and Dinner Bell community meals, around the dinner tables of family and friends, and by extension, through L.I.F.E. Ministries food pantry.

Finally, the acronym for “Jesus Christ, God’s Son, Savior,” spelled the Greek noun for fish. Some early Christian art depicting the last supper shows a fish on the plate in front of Jesus, as does the piece above by one of my favorite artists* He Qi. *[visit my office two see two more examples of his work in addition to two signed works at my home]

This Eastertide, may you celebrate the power of sharing food with others and the gift of rich table conversation.

Risen Indeed!

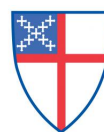

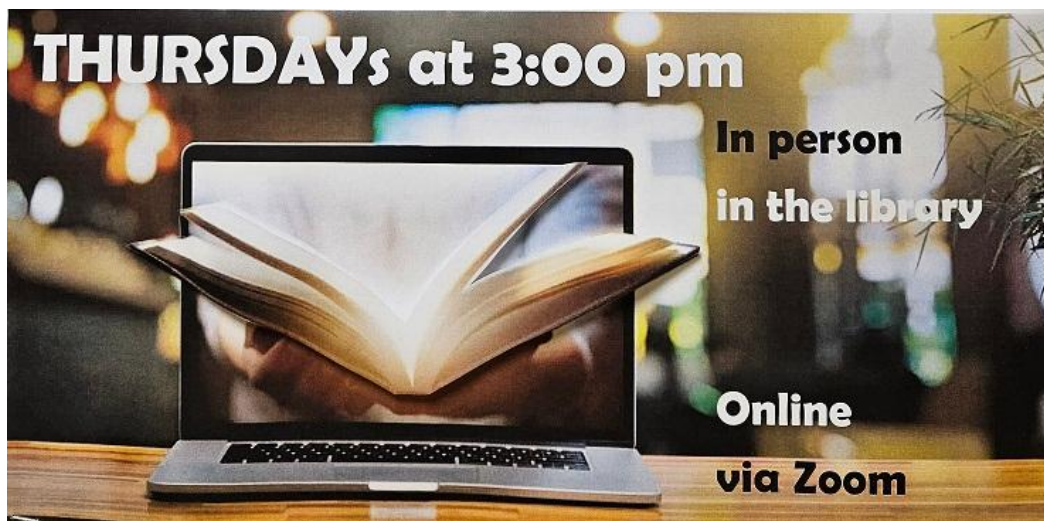

The arrangement above from Sunday April 7th was done by Karen Hasselman, the newest member of the Flower Guild . Thank you Karen!

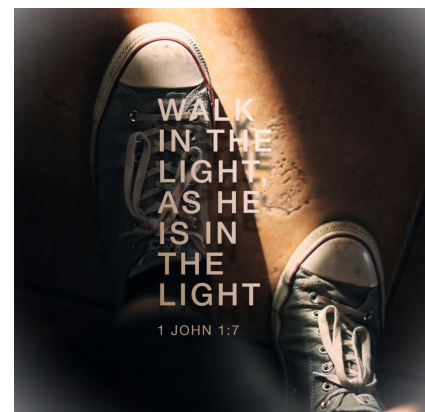

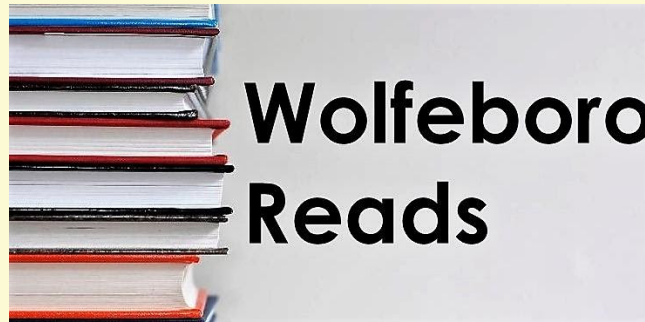

New Thursday Bible Study Begins April 11th

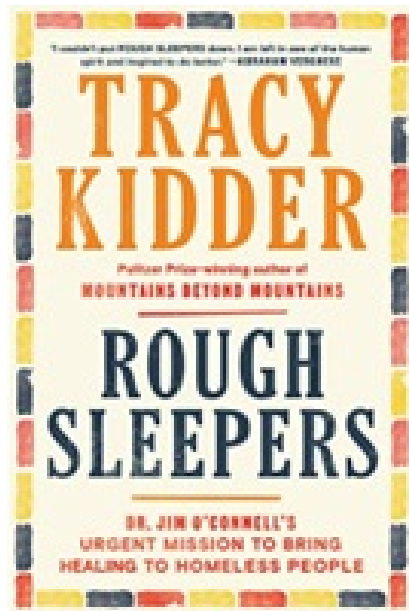
Our Thursday afternoon Bible Study will begin our walk through the first letter of John (which the epistle readings during Eastertide this year come from). In his letters, John expresses delight at believers who are "walking in the truth": behaving with that integrity which reflects the gospel. This involves not just correct doctrine and proper outward behavior, but also love for God and fellow believers. It's this love, John writes, that shows that the truth of the gospel has really been grasped, not as an abstract idea but as what it is, the very life of God himself at work in his people.



Join us Thursdays at 3:00 pm in the Beck Memorial Library (or via Zoom) followed by Eucharist as we explore becoming believers who are "walking in the truth" in our own day--people in whom the very life of God is at work for all to see.

Tuesdays, April 9, 16, 23 4:00 pm, *Rough Sleepers* by Tracy Kidder

When Jim O'Connell graduated from Harvard Medical School and was nearing the end of his residency at Massachusetts General Hospital, the chief of medicine made a proposal: Would he defer a prestigious fellowship and spend a year helping to create an organization to bring health care to homeless citizens? Jim took the job because he felt he couldn't refuse. But that year turned into his life's calling. Tracy Kidder spent five years following Dr. O'Connell and his colleagues as they served their thousands of homeless patients. In this book, we travel with O'Connell as he navigates the city, offering medical care, socks, soup, empathy, humor, and friendship to some of the city's most vulnerable citizens. He emphasizes a style of medicine in

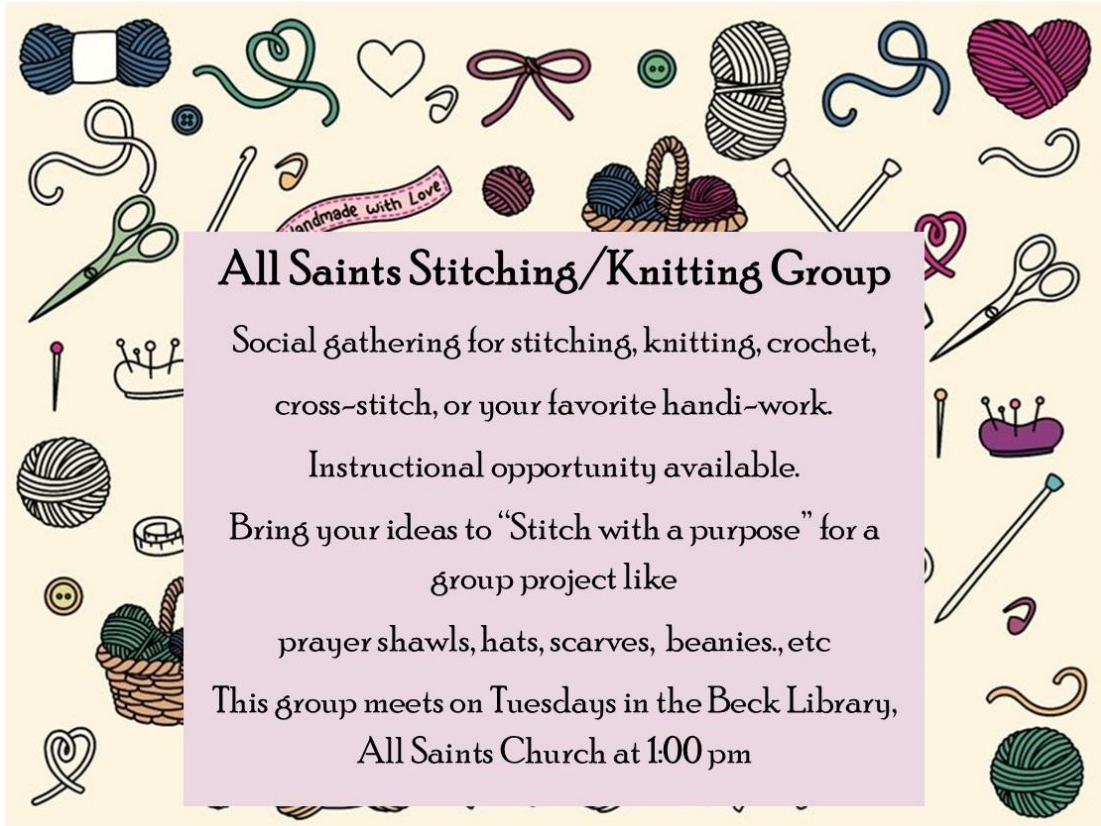
which patients come first, joined with their providers in what he calls "a system of friends."

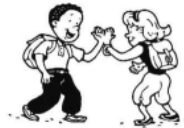
