The 23rd psalm appears six times in the Revised Common Lectionary's three-year cycle we use for Sunday worship, including the Fourth Sunday of Easter all three years. In addition to the repetition in the lectionary, there is the psalm's broad sacred and secular appeal. Almost every funeral or memorial service we host has included Psalm 23 (some clergy call it the Hollywood funeral reading) as it is the most widely known psalm. I too find comfort in its lines of comfort and assurance that proclaim the goodness and mercy of the One who shepherds us in life and in death.

This beloved psalm was interpreted in the fourth century as a description of our baptized life...



• The soul is restored by the gift and sustaining power of the Spirit;

• The right pathways are the life of those who follow the Way of Love;

• God's rod and staff are the law and gospel for guiding our journey of faith;

• The table is the Eucharist, with a cup overflowing with mercy and salvation; and

• The house of the Lord is the community of the church, where we enjoy God's goodness.

The psalm's verdant imagery coupled with our emerging spring, reminds me of the Easter hymn (Hymnal 1982 #204) *Now the Green Blade Rises...*

• Now the green blade rises from the buried grain, wheat that in dark earth many days has lain; love lives again, that with the dead has been; love is come again like wheat arising green.

• In the grave they laid him, love by hatred slain, thinking that he would never wake again; laid in the earth like grain that sleeps unseen; love is come again like wheat arising green.

• Forth he came at Easter, like the risen grain, see that for three days in the grave had lain; raised from the dead, my living Lord is seen; love is come again like wheat arising green.

• When our hearts are wintry, grieving, or in pain, your touch can call us back to life again, fields of our hearts that dead and bare have been; love is come again like wheat arising green.

May the joy and life of Easter rise like Jesus and the green all around us,




April Thursday Bible Study

It's this love, John writes, that shows that the truth of the gospel has really been grasped, not as an abstract idea but as what it is, the very life of God himself at work in his people.




Join us Thursdays at 3:00 pm in the Beck Memorial Library (or via Zoom) followed by Eucharist as




Tuesdays, April 9, 16, 23 4:00 pm, *Rough Sleepers* by Tracy Kidder

When Jim O'Connell graduated from Harvard Medical School and was nearing the end of his residency at Massachusetts General Hospital, the chief of medicine made a proposal: Would he defer a prestigious fellowship and spend a year helping to create an organization to bring health care to homeless citizens? Jim took the job because he felt he couldn't refuse. But that year turned into his life's calling. Tracy Kidder spent five years following Dr. O'Connell and his colleagues as they served their thousands of homeless patients. In this book, we travel with O'Connell as he navigates the city, offering medical care, socks, soup, empathy, humor, and friendship to some of the city's most vulnerable citizens. He emphasizes a style of medicine in

which patients come first, joined with their providers in what he calls "a system of friends."
