

Beloved Saints and Sinners,

This Sunday's image of how the risen Christ shares his life with us is the image of the vine. Christ the vine and we the branches are alive in each other, in the mystery of mutual abiding described in the gospel and the first letter of John.

Sunday the Gospel reading shares how Jesus lingers with the disciples before his death and prepares them for the time when he will no longer be present day to day to help them make their way in the world. Words slip from his mouth: "Apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5). These are bittersweet and difficult words as the disciples try to make sense of Jesus' impending death and the promise of his continued presence.

"Apart from me you can do nothing" may also be a difficult for those of us who get tangled in our self-reliant northern New England mindset,



Praying for the Unhoused

With the recent closing of Hope House, the only homeless shelter in our county, and after reading *Rough Sleepers* about homeless healthcare in Boston, many have asked what we can do. Here are 5 ways you can be in prayer for the unhoused:

1.) PRAY for every adult and child in Carroll County who has no place to call home. Pray that they would be connected to the resources they need to meet the most basic and essential needs and find access to shelter, adequate food, and health care.

For the needy shall not always be forgotten, and the hope of the poor shall not perish forever. (Psalm 9:18)

2.) PRAY for the healing hand of the Lord on our neighbors living on the streets. Pray that God would remove any physical, emotional, or mental barriers and illnesses they face to finding safe, stable housing and/or employment.

The blind receive their sight and the lame walk, lepers are cleansed and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised up, and the poor have good news preached to them. (Matthew 11:5)

3.) PRAY that the Holy Spirit would be moving us to outreach. Pray that Jesus would meet our neighbors on the streets in undeniable ways, that they might know Him as Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

The LORD is near to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit. (Psalm 34:18)

4.) PRAY for all who volunteer and serve in homeless outreach. Pray that they would be bold in proclaiming God's love for every single person made in God's image, and that the Lord would give them hearts that are properly motivated and aligned with God's.

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, for he has anointed me to bring Good News to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim that captives will be released, that the blind will see, and that the oppressed will be set free. (Luke 4:18)

5.) PRAY for the organizations, churches and social services who day in and day out serve our neighbors experiencing homeless. Pray that they would be encouraged in their work and that God would ignite a fire in their hearts that allows them to endure all difficulties.

If you pour yourself out for the hungry and satisfy the desire of the afflicted, then shall your light rise in the darkness and your gloom be as the noonday. (Isaiah 58:10)




Thursdays in the Beck Library and online via Zoom at 3:00 pm, followed by Eucharist



Wolfeboro Reads May Book


