The Collect of the Day Gracious Father, whose blessed Son Jesus Christ came down connecting the Word that became flesh in Jesus with the bringing forth of life and all things (my confirmation verse was John 1:1-5). Then we hear the witness of John the Baptist, highlighting Jesus' significance for the whole world (not just one group or chosen people). John sees Jesus approach him in the wilderness and proclaims "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!" (John 1:29). This Gospel lifts up the cosmic reach of Jesus and purpose for his life on earth. God's purpose in sending Jesus is "that the world might be saved through him" (John 3:17 which we'll hear Sunday).

While our world and lives include disease and evil, sin and brokenness, God's love for us and for the cosmic creation is complete, passionate, and sacrificial. God is not willing to settle for part of the world, or for just some special people. Instead of dismissing or destroying anything not pleasing to God, we're gifted God's own son, lifted up on the cross, so that all might have the opportunity for eternal life. The light of God shining down from the cross demonstrates the infinite gracious gift of love and proclaims God's desire to transform the broken and messy places in this world into places of forgiveness, healing, and wholeness.

Here are some reflections to focus on during your Lenten journey this week:

• **Today:** Create a prayer representing how you seek to serve God and follow Jesus. Read Matthew 5:15

• **Saturday:** What seminal moments have informed a need to return to Christ? Read Psalm 51:10

• **Sunday:** Experience worship in person or online this fourth Sunday in Lent

• **Monday:** What challenges are you facing today? Read Job 11:18

• **Tuesday:** How is the Jesus who walked the earth beckoning you to meet him? Read Mark. 10:46-52

• **Wednesday:** Try praying with Anglican prayer beads (or a Catholic rosary). Read Luke 18:1

• **Thursday:** Where do you find joy and passion? Read Luke 24:32



All Saints is helping to sponsor a family of Afghan Hazaras (a persecuted minority) refugees who fled to Baluchistan, Pakistan

hoping to emigrate to a safe country. The new Welcome Corps program has provided the first opportunity for citizens to sponsor such individuals to immigrate to the US. Eight people (including Amadou, Sarah Day, and Warren Muir) have applied to the Welcome Corps program to sponsor Ali Rezaye, his wife Rana, and their two young sons, Amir and Ovid, to immigrate to Manchester. During the coffee hour after the 10am (EDT) service this Sunday (Mar 10), Warren and Danielle Pierpont, who have been tutoring Ali and Rana respectively, will introduce the family to parishioners via a Skype online connection.

All Saints Community Labyrinth Project F.A.Q. for March 8th



Pastor Bill introduced the Community Labyrinth Project recently during his remarks at our annual meeting. As we discern and plan, you may have questions about labyrinths and each week we will share a frequently asked question here. Feel free to ask any questions of Pastor Bill or Linda Brown who are both trained labyrinth facilitators by <u>Veriditas</u> the non-profit organization committed to inspiring transformation through the labyrinth experience. The word "Veriditas" originated with Hildegard of Bingen and means "the greening power of life".

How does one prepare to walk a labyrinth?

During March our portable labyrinth will be set-up in the Stevens Room for use following midweek worship at noon on Wednesdays, and any other time the building is open (7:00 am-9:00 pm daily). You may find it helpful to sit and relax, clear your mind and become aware of your breath prior to walking the labyrinth. Spend a few minutes sitting to transition from the outside world. Say a prayer, read a sacred text, or spend some time outside the labyrinth before you begin.

• *Walk in prayer...* Many people walk the labyrinth as a prayer-walk, giving thanks and praise, asking God for help for self and others.

 \cdot *Walk in reflection...* This is an excellent place in which to meditate on a question, joy or concern. It is also wonderful to walk in silent meditation, letting go of thoughts and entering a sacred space of silence and solitude.

• *Walk as a body prayer...* The walk can be a prayer in itself. Carry a symbol of significance for you... feel free... be spontaneous... dance!







Thursday Afternoon Bible Study






